One of my fondest memories about my mother is watching her get ready for work in the morning. I would wake up and go into my parent's bathroom and watch my mom carefully put on her make up and do her hair. All the while we would talk about everything from boys, to life, to school, to the dreams we had. I learned so much from my mom while she would get ready in the early morning hours.

When my mom was in the hospital, my father helped her maintain her daily routine of putting on makeup. It was amazing to watch my mom smile and look so relieved to have this daily habit done for her. It was a something that my mom loved to do each day; it was her time, and it once again became my special time with my mother.

One day my mom expressed to her friend Janet that she didn't feel like a "woman" in the ugly blue hospital gown she had to wear everyday. It was heartbreaking. My mom, who

was the most beautiful woman inside and out, didn't feel good about how she looked. Janet and I talked and figured out a way to make my mom feel like a woman just by performing a few minor adjustments on some night-gowns.

Janet took store-bought ladies' nightgowns, cut the back down the middle and placed ribbons that could be tied to keep the gown secure when my mom put them on. They looked like hospital gowns, except they had a feminine touch. With the soft cotton of a nightgown and the alterations Janet so artistically made, it was a hospital gown any woman would be happy to wear. It was feminine; it was perfect for my beautiful mother.

The day my mother first saw the gowns was like Christmas morning. She was so happy to have a feminine hospital gown. It was a joyous moment for my mother, Janet,

and me. It reminded me of watching her get ready in the morning. It was not about the makeup, the hairstyle, or the clothes she wore that day it was about how she felt. It made my mother strong, and it made her feel pretty.

In view of our experience and seeing firsthand the emotional boost our Mother felt during her stay in the hospital, the Light Up the Room Foundation is starting a tradition of giving the same to those in need. We will give a three pack of "Running Angel" women's hospital gowns to women cancer patients in need. 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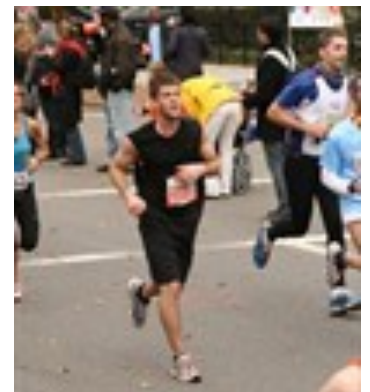
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NYC Marathon Fundraiser
